Energy is often identified as a key component of the European low-carbon electricity system. 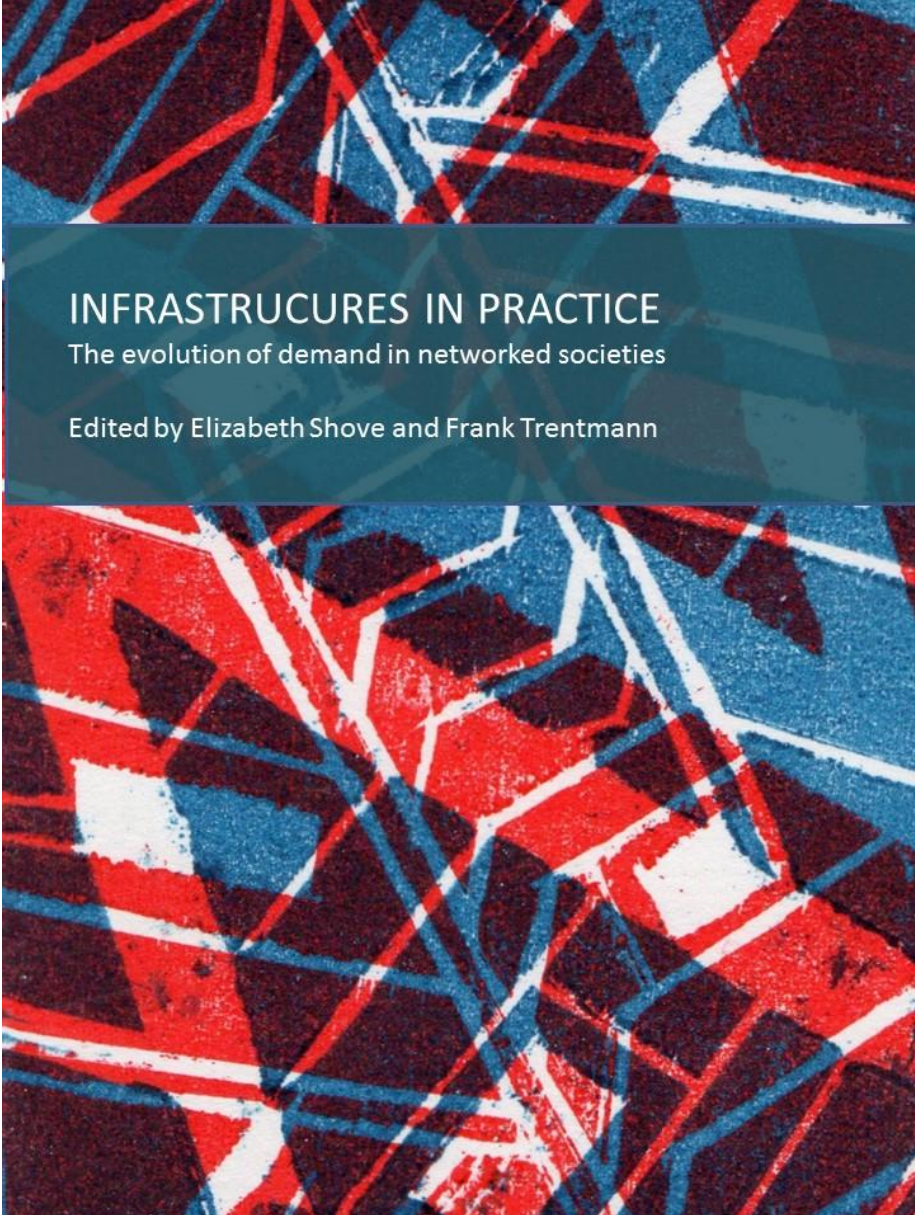
